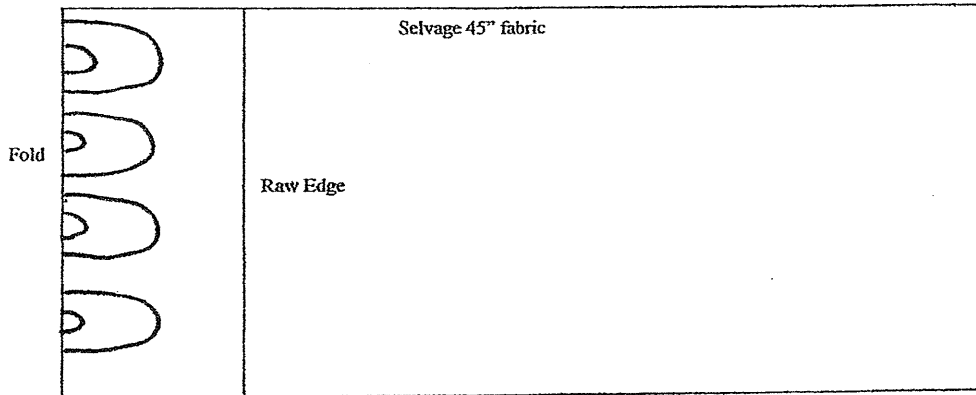


St. Brigid Baptismal Bibs

- ❖ 2 yards of white fabric can make 16-20 bibs. Fold fabric and cut out bibs in the following manner to maximize the use of the fabric:



- ❖ Press under $\frac{1}{4}$ inch along the raw edge around neckline. Slash around the curves. Sew close to edge.
- ❖ Press under $\frac{1}{4}$ around entire outer edge. Sew lace around this edge, with raw edge of lace on wrong side of bib. It takes about 1- $\frac{1}{4}$ yd of lace for each bib.
- ❖ The red cross can be made in many different ways:
 - Satin stitch by machine
 - Hand embroider using outline, chain stitch, etc.
 - Fuse 2 red strips of fabric or ribbon using Heat & Bond, Wonder Under, etc.
 - Draw a cross using red fabric paint.
 - Any other method you can think of.

- ❖ Press bibs nicely and bring to the Church Office.
