The Vincentians of Saint Brigid reach out to local families and individuals through home visits in order to develop a trust and understanding of their personal situation and needs


During visits, we share useful information on other local community services and resources which may provide additional assistance.

- Assist with the bi-annual food and clothing drive.
- Volunteer in the Saint Brigid food pantry.
