How to request a Prayer Quilt:

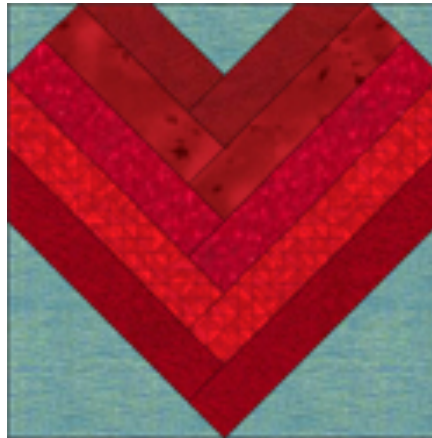

Diane Berdis and Marie Wood started the Prayer Quilt Ministry after both attended a “Gifts of the Holy Spirit” class, each coming up with the same spiritual gifts of craftsmanship and service.

The Prayer Quilt Ministry of St. Brigid is dedicated to praying for those who are ill or otherwise in need of comfort and prayers. We especially focus on those who are members of our St. Brigid parish but have made quilts for others in need as well.

We construct quilts and tie the layers together with floss. Each tie represents a

prayer for the individual and family or their personal intentions.

Those who have received prayer quilts enjoy ongoing comfort from their quilts.

We concentrate our efforts toward those who are seriously ill or undergoing major surgery and women with difficult pregnancies. We usually do not make bereavement quilts but there have been some exceptions. We have given prayer quilts to some with psychiatric health issues as well.

Someone must request a prayer quilt knowing that the recipient will accept the quilt and the prayers being said especially for them.
